Here Are 10 Easy Ways to Show Your Child Love:

You do not need a special occasion such as a birthday or holiday to show your love to your family. Everyday gestures such as a thoughtful note or a simple 'I love you' are powerful ways to show your children how much you care and how much they mean to you.

1. Write your child a love letter. Write down a few of the reasons why you love your child and why you think they are special. Mail this letter to your child.

2. Surprise them. Skip afternoon activities one day and take your child on an adventure. You can take them ice-skating, to the beach, or even take a walk in the park.

3. Read your child one more story. Say yes when your child asks for another story, even when you are tired. They will love the extra attention.

4. Frame a favorite picture. Print out a favorite picture of your child and write a note on the back of the photo describing why it is your favorite. Give them this photo to keep in their room.

5. Tell your child your favorite memory of them. Tell your child a positive memory you have of them. It could be the story of their birth or any other special moment.

6. Multiply the affection. Give your child a dozen hugs, tell them you love them twenty-five times, or give them a hundred kisses. Your child will love the silliness of the amount and they will enjoy the additional affection.

7. Dance, sing, and laugh. Put on your favorite "oldie" and show your child your moves. It does not matter what song; they will enjoy the time you spend together.

8. Lunch box love. Write a silly poem or write a message that reminds you of your child and put it in their lunch box. Your child will smile and feel loved even when you are apart.

9. Throw out the rules sometimes. Let your child play with every toy in their room, run in the rain, or play in the mud with them. Enjoy the beautiful, perfect moments of life's mess.

10. Tell your child you love them every day. Simple but strong, saying "I love you" is an easy way to show your infinite love to your child.
